ABOUT TODAY'S SERVICE: BAPTISM, ORDINATION, AND MINISTRY

BAPTISM and MINISTRY

The catechism of the Book of Common Prayer defines the ministry of all the baptized in the following way: "to represent Christ and his Church; to bear witness to him wherever they may be; and, according to the gifts given to them, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take their place in the life, worship, and governance of the church." The ministry of the Church is thus rooted in way in which we are empowered by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and thus "share in Christ's eternal priesthood."

Today's service emphasizes the baptismal roots of the Church's ministry through the baptismal versicles and collect with which the service opens and through the renewal of the baptismal covenant which concludes the Ministry of the Word and introduces the rite of ordination.

ORDAINED MINISTRY and PRIESTLY MINISTRY

The Church ordains men and women whom it calls to enable the whole Church to carry out its ministry of reconciliation. The threefold ministry which the Episcopal Church has inherited includes the ministry of the bishop who oversees the church in each diocese as apostle, chief priest, and pastor, the ministry of priests or presbyters who share with the bishop in the pastoral oversight of the church as the bishop's associates, and deacons, who assist the bishop and the presbyters in a ministry of servanthood.

Priestly ministry has as its special focus the church's pastoral leadership in the local congregation. Priests are called "to share with the bishop in the overseeing of the Church; to proclaim the gospel; to administer the Sacraments; and to bless and declare pardon in the name of God."

The RITE of ORDINATION

The Episcopal Church admits persons to the ordained ministry through "solemn prayer and the laying on of episcopal hands." Ordination begins with the examination of the candidates, through which the Church affirms their selection and call to the ordained ministry. This is followed by the people's prayer for those to be ordained, which includes the litany, the invocation of the Holy Spirit in the form of a hymn, and a period of silent prayer. The bishop concludes the people's prayer with a solemn prayer of consecration, during which the bishop lays hands on those who are being ordained. In the ordination of deacons, the bishop alone lays on hands. In the ordination of priests, other priests join in the laying on of hands. The laying on of hands is a gesture of blessing which asks God to equip those being ordained for the ministry to which they are called by the gift of the Holy Spirit. As the service continues, the newly ordained assumes the tasks to which they have been called in the Eucharistic liturgy.

I call upon all of you, therefore, as we proceed with the rite of ordination, to renew the Baptismal Covenant which is the

foundation of the Church's ministry.

Bishop: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus

Christ?

Peoble: I do.

Bishop: Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. People:

Bishop: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

Bishop: Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them?

And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers

who may have authority over you and your work?

Ordinand: I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the

Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Episcopal

Church.

The Ordinand signs the above declarations in the sight of all present.

Please stand.

Bishop: Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry, and the weight of your

responsibility in presenting Mary Moloney Haggerty for ordination to the sacred order of priests. Therefore if any of you know any impediment or crime because of which we should not proceed,

come forward now and make it known.

Bishop: Is it your will that Mary be ordained a priest?

People: It is.

Bishop: Will you uphold her in this ministry?

People: We will.

Bishop: In peace let us pray to the Lord.

THE EXAMINATION

All are seated except the Ordinand, who stands before the Bishop.

Bishop: My sister, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All

baptized people are called to make Christ known as Savior and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and

fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church.

As a priest, it will be your task to proclaim by word and deed the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to share in the administration of Holy Baptism and in the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you.

In all that you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come.

My sister, do you believe that you are truly called by God and his Church to this priesthood?

Ordinand: I believe I am so called.

Bishop: Do you now in the presence of the Church commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

Ordinand: I do.

Bishop: Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of your bishop?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you be diligent in the reading and study of the Holy Scriptures, and in seeking the knowledge

of such things as may make you a stronger and more able minister of Christ?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you endeavor so to minister the Word of God and the sacraments of the New Covenant, that

the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you undertake to be a faithful pastor to all whom you are called to serve, laboring together with

them and with your fellow ministers to build up the family of God?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you do your best to pattern your life, and that of your family and community, in accordance

with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, both for yourself and

for others, offering all your labors to God, through the mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the

sanctification of the Holy Spirit?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things give you the grace and power to perform

them.

Ordinand: Amen.

THE CONSECRATION OF A PRIEST

All now stand except the Ordinand, who kneels facing the Bishop.

Hymn 504, Veni Creator Spiritus, is sung by the cantor. A period of silent prayer follows, the people remain standing.

Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire, and lighten with celestial fire.

Anoint and cheer our soiled face with the abundance of thy grace.

Thou the anointing Spirit art, who dost thy sevenfold gifts impart.

Keep far our foes, give peace at home: where thou art guide, no ill can come.

Thy blesséd unction from above is comfort, life, and fire of love.

Teach us to know the Father, Son, and thee, of both, to be but One,

Enable with perpetual light the dullness of our blinded sight.

that through the ages all along, this may be our endless song:

praise to thy eternal merit, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Silence is kept for a time.

Bishop:

God and Father of all, we praise you for your infinite love in calling us to be a holy people in the kingdom of your Son Jesus our Lord, who is the image of your eternal and invisible glory, the firstborn among many brethren, and the head of the Church. We thank you that by his death he has overcome death, and, having ascended into heaven, has poured his gifts abundantly upon your people, making some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry and the building up of his body.

Here the Bishop lays hands upon the head of the ordinand, the Priests who are present also laying on their hands. At the same time the Bishop prays

Bishop:

Therefore, Father, through Jesus Christ your Son, give your Holy Spirit to Mary; fill her with grace and power, and make her a priest in your Church.

The Bishop then continues

May she exalt you, O Lord, in the midst of your people; offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to you; boldly proclaim the gospel of salvation; and rightly administer the sacraments of the New Covenant. Make her a faithful pastor, patient teacher, and wise councilor. Grant that in all things she may serve without reproach, so that your people may be strengthened and your Name glorified in all the world. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever.

People: AMEN.

The new priest is now vested according to the order of priests.

The Bishop gives a Bible to the newly ordained.

Bishob:

Receive this Bible as a sign of the authority given you to preach the Word of God and to administer his holy Sacraments. Do not forget the trust committed to you as a priest of the Church of God.

THE PEACE

The new priest now says to the congregation

Priest: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And also with you.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant: It is truly right, and good and joyful, to give you thanks, all-holy God, source of life and fountain of mercy. Through the great shepherd of your flock, Jesus Christ our Lord; who after his resurrection sent forth his apostles to preach the Gospel and to teach all nations; and promised to be with them always, even to the end of the ages. Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we say:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Celebrant: Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace.

But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Celebrant: Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world. Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your daughters and sons, that with Blessed Mary the Godbearer, Blessed Barnabas the Apostle and all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**

Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God.

There will be a communion station at the front of the Nave. All baptized Christians are welcome to receive communion. Please maintain social distancing in the aisle while coming forward for communion. If you prefer not to receive communion, please come forward and hold your arms across your chest to receive a blessing.

Those watching at home may, if they wish, say this prayer during the time of Communion:

Lord of the Feast, we thank you for gathering us as your people. We call to remembrance the many times we have been fed at your table and we lament our distance now. Be present Lord Jesus as you were present with your disciples, be known to us in the breaking of the bread, and may your Holy Spirit sustain us and all your Church until we can gather together again. And thus with joy we meet our Lord. His presence, always near, is in such friendship better known: we see, and praise him here.

Together met, together bound, we'll go our different ways, and as his people in the world, we'll live and speak his praise.
